<p><b>Preconference 1</b> <b>(1:00 - 4:00)</b></p>	<p>Creative Play Therapy Strategies for Delivering the Cognitive Behavioral Therapy Model to Children &amp; Adolescents</p> <p><i>Lecole J. Sanders MSW, LISW</i></p>	<p>An interactive workshop that both supports and inspires therapists, clinical social workers, play therapists and school counselors to think creatively as they provide services to children and adolescents using the CBT model. The play therapy strategies are useful for working with a variety of presenting problems.</p>
<p><b>Preconference 2</b> <b>(9:00 - Noon)</b></p>	<p>The Somatic Work: Understanding the Embodied Experience in the Counseling Session</p> <p><i>L. Marinn Pierce PhD, LPCC, NCC</i></p>	<p>This workshop will focus on the neurobiological underpinnings of somatic interventions for the treatment of trauma and related concerns. Participants will explore the relationships among the neurophysiology, the soma, and the counseling process with particular emphasis on supporting the connection between the body and mind, and the importance of neuroception in the counseling relationship.</p>

Teaching methods will include lecture, demonstration, discussion, skill development, and case study analysis.</p>

Leslie, LPC</i></p>	<p>This presentation will present methods to discover and obtain mental, emotional, and behavioral resources for clients, which can help move therapy sessions toward dynamic and healing interactions. It will also introduce you to the V.I.B.E.S. (Values, Identity, Behaviors, Environment, and Spirituality) process for finding resources.</p>

Participants will explore novel concepts for engaging supervisees in order to build a more meaningful group supervision experience.</p>
