Don't Stand on the Sidelines—Get in the Game

Happy New Year! I hope that your holiday season was filled with some well-deserved rest and relaxation as well as plenty of good cheer and good times with family and friends. I hope that you may consider engaging in a new venture this year and I have some prime opportunities for involvement in your SCCA. As the football metaphor implies, our team is only as strong as its members. How much we practice and work together will determine how far we advance toward our common goals. This year help us write a successful playbook by remaining involved in whatever capacity you can to ensure the viability of our activities and organizations.

Our esteemed Parliamentarian, Mr. Jim Kiser, has brought to my attention the need for us to grow our state divisions. Currently, our two strongest and most organized state divisions are the SC School Counselor Association (SCSCA) and the SC Association for Multicultural Counseling and Development (SCAMCD), and these are the only two state groups with elected leadership. Two other state divisions, the SC Career Development Association (SCCDA) and the SC Association for Counselor Education and Supervision (SCACES), have volunteer leaders. The final two state divisions, the SC Association for Humanistic Education and Development (SCAHEAD) and the SC Association for Specialists in Group Work (SCASGW), have no leadership at this time. Once dynamic and integral parts of the state branch, these state divisions had outstanding leadership, which was subsequently lost through attrition. At issue is that our state divisions need to follow the same policies and procedures as our divisional organizations at the national level, most of which include having a core body of members and elected leadership.

To work to remedy this situation, we are planning to hold meetings at the SCCA Annual Conference in February. If you are a member of one of these groups, or if you are interested in becoming a member or potential leader, I hope that you will plan to attend the division meeting in your specific area of interest. Meetings will be held on Friday, February 4, 2011, during the workshop sessions according to the following schedule:

- 9:10 am–10:10 am SC Association for Multicultural Counseling and Development
- 1:45 pm–2:45 pm SC Career Development Association
- 1:45 pm–2:45 pm SC Association for Humanistic Education and Development
- 2:55 pm–3:55 pm SC Association for Counselor Education and Supervision
- 4:00 pm–5:00 pm SC Association for Specialists in Group Work

The SC School Counselor Association will meet in January to prepare for their Legislative Breakfast, so they will not have a meeting at the SCCA Conference.

Groups for which there is no longer an interest will be disbanded. 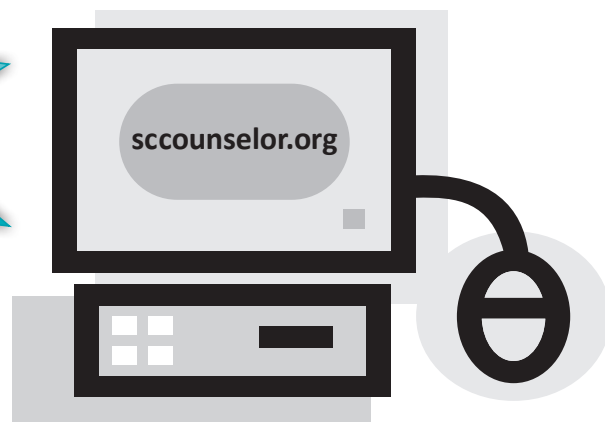

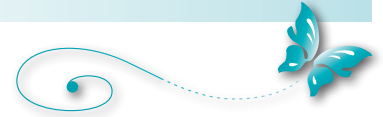

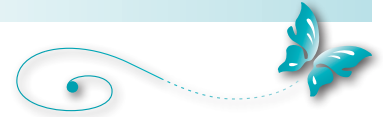
